







### UWP Political Leader strongly condemns alleged arson at Melville Hall



Political Leader of the United Workers Party (UWP) Lennox Linton strongly condemns all forms of violence, vandalism and disruption of lives.

Linton's remarks come in light of a suspected arson which destroyed a communication tower servicing the Douglas-Charles Airport.

Speaking at press conference at the Prevost Cinemal on Thursday morning, Linton said the incident is of grave concern to the UWP.

"There are a couple of matters that have surfaced in recent times that is of grave concern to us," he said. "We don't know what exactly has happened, we are hearing opinions from the government side and their suggestions of arson. We would want to await the results of a complete investigation by the authorities before we address this matter in a more comprehensive way."

He said the UWP will not stand for any form of violence and vandalism

"And to the extent that this development could have been an act of vandalism, or any other such thing, we totally and absolutely condemn it without reservation."

At a meeting in Riviere Cyrique on Wednesday evening, Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit told his supporters that he knows who set the fire and encouraged his supporters to admit that they all knew who set the fire.

It is expected that the police authorities will seek assistance from Roosevelt Skerrit with their investigations.





Mr John D Charlton director of Geology and mining at W.S.P. in Canada, rated Fitz's jasper as probably the best in the world.



Contrary to what Gerald Burton, Tony Astaphan and other local legal 'luminaries' say, you would be on the wrong side of Dominica Law because, although your name on the Electors List indicates that you are a registered voter, your failure to satisfy the Law relating to the pre-election residency requirement, you are a registered voter who is not eligible to vote in this election. That places you in violation of Dominica Election Law. In addition, by accepting a ticket to travel and cash to vote as requested, you would be engaging in an exchange of money with an un-authorized agent which also places

you in violation of item #6. This would be the case even if, unlike 2009 when tickets were handed directly to recruited voters, you were given a money order or cheque to go purchase your ticket from an authorized travel agent.

Contrary to what Paul Alexander says, you would then be on the wrong side of US Law because as a Passport holder (or permanent resident or other person enjoying the protection of legal residence in the US as a student, for example) you would be in violation of the warning contained in item #6 of the US Passport which requires that you observe all laws of the country to which you travel.

The two major questions to be asked by all those who have been recruited to vote for the Labour Party in this election, are the following:

1. Is this vote for Labour worth risking of all that I have worked for in America?
